

Dental students' perception of the English language process

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Freshmen belonging to the 2020 Dental Programme were asked about their perception of the English language process in the school system. 38 students out of 41 who passed the placement test answered the survey. 32 students took the class but only 18 answered the survey between March & May 2021.

The survey consisted of three Likert scales, perception, motivation and learning strategies and open questions.

FINDINGS

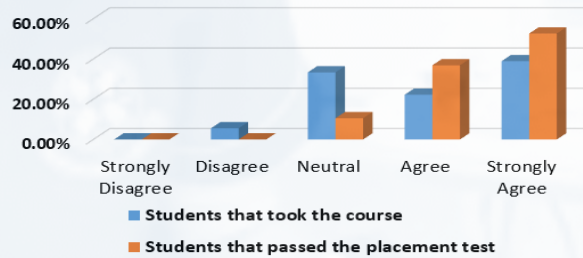
- Good teachers
