In the paper Silvana and Gabriel presented these features around the word INSPIRE. This session introduces an updated version of INSPIRE based on the latest findings published since then. It offers practical examples of CPD programmes informed by these insights that support teachers to develop the needed depth of expertise to implement new approaches and strategies competently and confidently in their practice.
